Dillon Strouse is full of life and always seems to be laughing. Dillon was diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy when he was a baby and has never let his condition damper his spirits or his outlook on life. In fact, in many ways, his challenges have inspired him to greater things.

At the age of 21, Dillon decided he wanted to work, support himself, and just be a "normal guy" and not be defined as the "guy in the wheelchair." He made his dream of starting his own business a reality by launching his own DJ and party planning business, Strouse Entertainment .He is also a motivational speaker. The success of his business has allowed him to hire and oversee a part-time staff of nine and he recently purchased two homes, intending to branch out into real estate.

Dillon's independence is enhanced through his individualized wheel-chair from UDS Custom Wheelchair Seating where he has been a client since his childhood. Dear Friends of UDSF,

About a year ago, UDSF moved into our new campus at 2270 Erin Court. We consolidated multiple rental locations into our newly purchased home. We felt that this would allow us to grow and expand the scope of our services. We also felt this environment would be a great place to work and would help us to recruit and retain talented and caring employees.

An ultimate goal was to create a great customer experience and exceptional customer care.

I appreciate the opportunity to update you with our progress. UDSF has seen excellent growth of 5.2% in the last 6 months and expanded our number of PA counties currently served to 50. We look to be statewide in all 67 counties in 2020. Our care management caseload has grown by several hundred new clients. Our CWS and Mobility and Rehab programs

are serving 8-10 additional clients per month. Our Home Modifications program has grown over 10% as well and is the springboard for launching a new UDSF entity.

To sustain our growth and expansion we have added 27 new employees at Erin Court. We also won a National Award for our Quality of Care and received our three year national quality assurance accreditation which signifies that our organization is well managed and has met a high standard of quality of care. We are well on our way in moving forward with our goals.

Thanks to you, we are enhancing abilities and changing lives for the more than 5,000 individuals with disabilities that we serve.

Meet Michael and His Service Dog Lux

LUX OPENS A WHOLE NEW WORLD FOR MICHAEL AND HIS FAMILY



Lux is a graduate of the UDS Service Dog program. He received extensive training and official certification and his specific talents and abilities are geared toward assisting his person, Michael.

Michael was a non-verbal boy with Autism and began participation in the program two years ago after his family had tried special schools and other treatment methods.

Lux's presence in Michael's life has impacted him – and his entire family – in profound ways. Based on a behavior assessment of milestones, Michael's development went from that of an 18-month-old to that of a four-year-old, thanks to Lux.

Michael's parents, Janice and Kerry, shared the following with UDS: "Having Lux made Michael connect to his world, which made all of his therapy sessions more effective - creating positive, unpredicted gains in his ability to function in all areas of life."

Michael no longer wanders off and has learned to focus. As Lux learns commands step-by-step, Michael begins to process, One, Two, Three directions and concepts. When Michael is upset, he asks Lux to lie down with him – which calms him. Amazingly, Michael now talks, makes direct eye contact, responds to his name, and communicates his wants or needs and lets us know if he is

hurt. Michael wears shoes now and keeps clothes on, even a life jacket."

Challenger Football and cheerleading is unique to Lancaster County and includes young players and cheerleaders with developmental, cognitive, and/or physical disabilities for a season of non-contact (though action-packed!) football

UDS is fortunate to have the wonderful participation of so many players, cheerleaders, family members, and volunteers.

For one player, Kyle, his time with Challenger turned into a family affair when his sister, Katie, was not content sitting on the sidelines. After working with Coach Randy, she became a volunteer referee.

The UDS Challenger Football and Cheerleading program provides the opportunity for young people with various disabilities to participate in a team sport – sometimes for the very first time in their lives!

Kyle and Katie's mother, Renee, is thankful for this program that provides so many benefits to youth with disabilities. She said that since playing football with Challenger, Kyle has become more social and more aware of others' feelings and he has become more confident and built new friendships.

Katie appreciates the opportunity to volunteer with Challenger which she describes as "accepting and loving" and as referee she enjoys getting to meet everyone and "help make their experience better."


