



IN-PATIENT HOSPITAL EXPENSES

Below are adjusted expenses for nonprofit and government hospitals per inpatient day in 2022 in every U.S. State, according to the latest estimates provided by Kaiser State Health Facts.

The figures are based on information from the 2022 American Hospital Association Annual Survey. They are an estimate of the expenses incurred in a day of inpatient care and have been adjusted higher to reflect an estimate of outpatient service volumes, according to the Kaiser Family Foundation.

The Foundation notes the figures are "only and estimate of expenses incurred by the hospital" for one day of inpatient care and do not substitute actual charges or reimbursement for care provided.

AVERAGE RATES REIMBURSED TO HOSPITALS PER INPATIENT DAY (Avg. of all Payors)

Avg. Cost of Custodial Care Per Inpatient Day = \$650 - \$700

Note: Custodial Care is what it costs the hospital to provide basic care to a patient when they no longer meet medical necessity and the insurance company is not paying. It includes room and board, nursing care, etc. This is the amount of revenue a hospital loses for each day a patient remains in the hospital but does not need clinical care.

Based on the above information, there is potential for a hospital to lose up to \$3,695 per day for each day a bed is filled by a patient that does not meet a medical necessity requirement.

The ACMS program averages 6 months of follow-up post hospitalization for less than the cost of 2 uncovered patient days in the hospital before annual Medicaid adjustments.
